### **PrintPuzzles**:

Bindery refers to how a printed piece is finished, but it also includes decorative cover options. Typically, it is driven by what the end-product is supposed to look like. Here are a few of the many print terms when it comes to bindery:

- **Score:** When a machine scores paper, it bends the fibers to assist in an easy fold. For example, thank-you cards are flat with the middle of the card scored for easy folding.
- **Trim:** Refers to cutting paper to the final, finished size.
- **Fold:** Scoring for booklets, or anything that needs to be smaller. Folding also ensures that all page elements, such as headers, are kept aligned when the papers are folded.
- Collate: Multi-sheet projects are printed and sorted in a way that creates a complete set as your printers do at home.
- Perforate: Tiny holes are punched into the sheet to allow for an easy, clean tear. An example would be a bill you receive with a tear-off section.

# TIPS FOR DEALING WITH BREAST CANCER

October is Breast Cancer Awareness month. With about 1 in 8 women getting breast cancer at some point in their life it is important to get the message out. To do our part, we have listed some tips recommended by Dr. Julie Gralow, Director of Breast Medical Oncology Seattle Cancer Care Alliance, that could help you or a loved one navigate through the diagnosis and treatment.

- Get specifics on your diagnosis and treatment. In order to maximize your time with your providers, bring your questions with you in writing to your appointments. Keep a list of questions that arise between visits so you don't forget, and take notes of the answers.
- Get the support you need for talking about your diagnosis. Look for a local support group for women with breast cancer or ask your hospital to help you find appropriate resources in your area.
- If necessary, seek help in navigating financial issues.
   Your hospital or clinic should have a social worker, patient navigator or financial services department to help you manage financial issues and deal with private insurance companies, Medicare and Medicaid.
- Good nutrition is a must! Eat a diet full of vegetables, fruits, whole grains, nuts, seeds and legumes such as black beans and lentils. Proper nutrition fights cancer symptoms like nausea and lethargy.
- Rest. Some people are able to work throughout their cancer treatment. Yet for some, reducing one's work capacity or taking a break altogether may be necessary. Ask your employer about your options and remember that proper rest is essential when fighting the side effects of the treatment.
